Data will once again be reported using a set of spreadsheets, which can be found at the ALISE website: www.alise.org. Schools are requested to complete the checklist and each of the six spreadsheets, which include:

- 2. Faculty
- 3. Students
- 4. Curriculum
- 5. Income and Expenditure
- 6. Continuing Education

Please note that data for the Statistical Report are imported and compiled directly from the spreadsheets. Datafiles in other formats, such as Word or PDF, are not usable.

Please note the following instructions, which are also included in the spreadsheets:

- 1. Data should be entered in blue cells only.
- 2. Grey cells are locked because they contain formulas.
- 3. Some cells have small red triangles in their upper right hand corner. Place the cursor over the triangle to get a more detailed explanation of what should be entered in that particular cell.
- 4. Please avoid changing the spreadsheet structure. Additional lines may be added as necessary, but please be judicious in adding lines and do so only when instructions allow for addition of lines.
- Anything you can do to make the process of collecting, importing, and tabulating data will make things easier for the ALISE Statistics Program team and speed production of the 2010 ALISE Statistical Report.
