Message from ALISE President Michèle Cloonan

Welcome to the 2009 ALISE Conference. This year's theme, "Transforming LIS Education for the 21st Century: i-Create," explores the complementary missions of libraries, museums, and archives as memory institutions, and the role of the information professional in these settings. Digital resources have blurred the distinctions between these institutions for the many users who visit collections online. Yet despite similarities libraries, museums, and archives continue to play distinctive roles in our culture. For almost a decade, the Institute of Museum and Library Services has funded cross-institutional collaborations, and this conference will look at the research that has emerged, beginning with the keynote speakers, and also in some of the panel and the refereed-paper sessions. LIS programs are now offering courses on museum informatics, and there are new opportunities for students and faculty alike to explore issues in cultural heritage information.

The convergence of memory institutions is a long-standing interest of mine. In choosing Tula Giannini and Paul Marty to develop this theme for the ALISE 2009 conference, I found two innovators. Paul has written extensively about museum informatics and teaches a course on it, and Tula has created innovative new programs at Pratt which draw on the School's strong presence in the arts as well as the cultural resources of New York.

There are many other activities that we hope will draw you to Denver. Birds of a Feather is back by popular demand, there will be a reception at the Denver Public Library, and we will hold a birthday party for JELIS in celebration of its 50th year.

I look forward to greeting you in the mile-high city.

You will be pleased to find the return of popular program events such as the Works-in-Progress Poster session, Birds of a Feather, Vita and Portfolio Review, and the Publishing Panel. New this year, we are delighted to introduce the "ALISE Academy" and a special morning workshop on "Community in Online Pedagogy."

The closing conference event on Friday afternoon explores the information profession in cultural heritage organizations.

The 2009 ALISE conference considers the formal and informal, physical and virtual worlds of information as they converge and diverge, as well as the ways in which we experience information as it flows through our daily lives. We hope that you will find that our beloved LIS field is at the heart of 21st century change fueled by today's global embrace of information-Culture-Research-Education-Arts-Technology and Experience.
